

# Pre-Employment Transition Services



Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) is a federal-state program that helps individuals with disabilities prepare for, find, or keep a job. VR's Pre-Employment Transition Services help students with disabilities prepare for a career, continue their education, or find a job after high school.

## What are the Pre-Employment Transition Services?

- Job Exploration Counseling
- Work Readiness Training
- Work-Based Learning Experiences
- Self-Advocacy & Peer Mentoring
- Postsecondary Educational Counseling

## Who can participate in services?

Students with disabilities ages 14-21 who are currently enrolled in school.

## How does a student access these services?

Students can:

- Contact a VR office
- Request a referral from their school

# The Pre-Employment Transition Services

1. **Job Exploration Counseling** - Explores career path options that are best suited to your skills, abilities, aptitudes, and interests.
2. **Work Readiness Training** – Focuses on employability and related skills that prepare you to work. Resume writing, mock interviews, searching for and applying for jobs are covered as a part of this training.
3. **Work-Based Learning Experiences** – Provides practical, hands-on training for employability skills. These experiences focus on practicing social skills and building relationships.
4. **Self-Advocacy Training and Peer Mentoring** – Teaches you how to talk about your needs and make decisions about your own life to become more independent.
5. **Postsecondary Educational Counseling** – Provides information about continuing education options, school choice, accessing financial aid, etc.

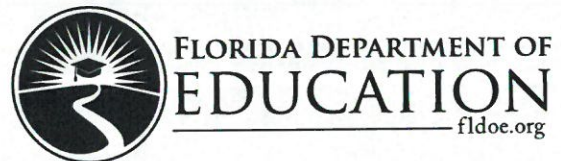
